

Civitas Senior Living announces leadership transition



Civitas now owns and operates 32 communities across several states, with more than 2,500 employees serving more than 5,000 older adults.



JNL Technologies names Brian Vitense national sales director


Brian Vitense has been hired as national sales director at [JNL Technologies](#) in Ixonia, WI.
